

A Brief History of Urbana...

- Founded in 1805 and incorporated in 1876
- Urbana is the county seat of Champaign County, Ohio.
- Some interesting history of the town and area...
 - Headquarters to the NW Army during the war of 1812.
 - Participated in the underground railroad during the Civil War.
 - 3 rail lines took the population from 1,070 to over 7,000 by 1880.
- Today, Urbana is the home to over 12,000 residents...
 - Yes, only 4,000 more people in 143 years but they're very good people!

Notable residents of the area...


- Warren Grimes, "Father of Aviation Lighting"
 - Produced the first navigation lights for aircraft
 - His company is now known as Honeywell Aviation
 - Honeywell Aviation is still located in Urbana





- Simon Kenton

- Frontiersman and soldier
- Fought in the war of 1812
- Scout for European Settlers against Indians
- Close friend of Daniel Boone
- Survived multiple "gauntlet runs" with Indians that typically resulted in death
- Buried in Urbana's Oakdale cemetery
- Subject of the book "The Frontiersman"







Another quick fact...The Lincoln Burial Train

After Lincoln's assassination on April 14, 1865, the funeral train left Washington DC on April 21, 1865. It had nine cars, including a baggage car, hearse car, and the President's car (built for use by the president and other officials and containing a parlor, sitting room, and sleeping apartment). The President's car was draped in mourning and carried the coffins of Lincoln and his son.

The train not only ran through Urbana on its way to Illinois, but it stopped in town at a station that's now a local coffee shop and restaurant called...The Depot. Great place to take your customers for breakfast and lunch!
